PARENTS & FRIENDS

The role of the Parents and Friends is predominantly to raise money for the school with an aim to hand over \$20,000 each year via both minor and major fundraisers. Many of these fundraisers have a social element and aim to get the whole school community involved. Our committee also handles a number of other roles within the school community such as:

- Running the uniform shop which involves being at the shop twice a week, filling orders, washing second hand clothes, stock takes and accounting.

- Organising events which don't have an emphasis on fundraising: Prep Parents Champagne Morning; Prep Social; Mother's and Father's Day Stalls and Father's Day breakfast.

PARISH HIGHLIGHTS ACROSS THE YEARS

1924 Archbishop Daniel Mannix laid the Foundation stone

Christmas 1924 First Mass Celebrated

1925 arrival of Presentation Sisters

1925 St. Mary's School commenced Prep to Grade 8 School enrolment 62

1924-26 Father Mangan PP 1926 - 1939 Father Dan Coakley

1939 To assist Father Dan Coakley Father Brian Burke came as assistant Priest. Father Brian Burke had a great influence on the young people of the parish and was instrumental in getting them so involved

1948 New School building commenced – enrolment of 315 pupils. By 1950 there were 472 students and by 1956 488 students were enrolled.

1968 School caught fire additions were added after this event.

1970 Presentation Sisters leave school and 1st Lay Principal - Joan Ryder. At this time a grant was given to build new toilets. The Tennis Club also raised funds for a new building.

1976 Liturgy Committee established to embrace the changes of Vatican 2 giving parishioners the opportunity to participate in and guide the weekly Liturgy.
