



150th Anniversary Of The Proclamation Of Saint Joseph

As Patron Of The Universal Church



The following is an extract from the Apostolic Letter **PATRIS CORDE OF THE HOLY FATHER FRANCIS:**

"Saint Joseph is universally invoked as the "patron of a happy death".

Now, one hundred and fifty years after his proclamation as Patron of the Catholic Church by Blessed Pius IX (8 December 1870), I would like to share some personal reflections on this extraordinary figure, so close to our own human experience. For, as Jesus says, "out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks" (Mt 12:34). My desire to do so increased during these months of pandemic, when we experienced, amid the crisis, how "our lives are woven together and sustained by ordinary people, people often overlooked. People who do not appear in newspaper and magazine headlines, or on the latest television show, yet in these very days are surely shaping the decisive events of our history. Doctors, nurses, storekeepers and supermarket workers, cleaning personnel, caregivers, transport workers, men and women working to provide essential services and public safety, volunteers, priests, men and women religious, and so very many others...How many are praying, making sacrifices and interceding for the good of all". Each of us can discover in Joseph– the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence- an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble. Saint Joseph reminds us that those who appear hidden or in the shadows can play an incomparable role in the history of salvation. A word of recognition and of gratitude is due to them all."
