**Psalm 29** is a song of praise and thanksgiving for deliverance. The person praying addresses no less that eight times Lord declaring he will sing praises to him. His feelings are intense and this gives a dramatic liveliness to the psalm.

The psalmist rejoices in God who has rescued him fro mortal danger. Preserved him from the ridicule of his enemies. He invites us to join him in his thanksgiving. This act of thanksgiving is external.

The psalm shows us that we must never let ourselves be ensnared by the dark confusion of despair when it seems all is lost. Or to fall into the illusion that we can be saved by ourselves, with our own resources. The psalmist becomes the messenger of God's goodness and faithfulness.
