Part 2 The Church's Response to the Royal Commission
Why hadn't you already released the Truth, Justice, and Healing Council report? (Contd)

- The Implantation Advisory Group (IAG) made up mostly of eminent lay people, including experts in the areas of safeguarding and child protection, has the task of monitoring the Church's response to the Royal Commissions Recommendations.

NATIONAL REDRESS SCHEME


- The Catholic Church was an early and consistent supporter of the National Redress Scheme.
- We believe that aspects of the Redress scheme can help support people who suffered child sexual abuse in institutional setting, including apologies, pastoral support and financial payments in some cases.
- In some ways, it is similar to what has been available to survivors through Toward Healing and the Melbourne Response, but is judged and administered by a group independent of the Catholic Church.

Why did you get the cap for redress payments lowered from \$200,000 to \$150,000

- The Catholic Church supported the redress scheme and would have been prepared to contribute whatever the Commonwealth Government decided was appropriate.
- The Commonwealth Government established and is administering the independent scheme and we will abide by its determinations and its policy settings.

Plenary Council 2020
 Listen to what the Spirit is saying...

Plenary Council 2020 Question:
What do you think God is asking of us in Australia at this time?

Step 2:

- It may be helpful to introduce Step 2 by reminding people that it is important we receive the responses from each other- it is not a time to correct or challenge anyone's story or response.
- It may be hard to choose just one topic but that's ok. It is highly likely that participants will enter into more than one listening and dialogue session.

Step 3

- At this listening stage the facilitator may need to remind participants of the importance of listening deeply to each others stories. Again this is not a time to challenge –it may be appropriate to ask a question of clarification or the facilitator may wish to ask an open ended question such as ‘would you like to share a little more about how you felt when..... happened?’
- If there is disagreement the facilitator may wish to just acknowledge that we come with different views but in this process all views are equally valued and valuable.
- It is helpful to draw the participants attention to the suggested opening phrases ‘I feel your sharing has helped me to....’ or ‘from what you have shared with me, I now understand...’ because it reminds us to respond to the story we have heard from our hearts

Step 4

- It will be important for the response to be submitted and in some cases the facilitator may be asked to do this.
