Part 5 The Church's Response to the Royal Commission

- Why won't priests behave like others who have to report suspicions about someone abusing children?**
- There are some practical consideration when it comes to Confession. Regardless of who is confessing, the priest may have no idea of the identity of the person who is reporting abuse-their own or someone else's.
 - Priest are committed to eradicating child sexual abuse and they follow through on that by urging abusers to turn themselves into the police and urging victims to share their story with a trusted adult who can help them.
 - We understand that some people focus on confession because they thing it highlights privilege and exemption for the Church. However , the Sacramental nature of confession is of profound importance for Catholics.
 - The reality remains that the danger to vulnerable people within this area are minimal.
 - The Catholic Church is committed to reforms that will improve the safety of children.
 - While there has been much speculation about changes to the Seal of fconfession, the church leaders are convinced that other practices and procedures, protocols recommended by the RC will be more fruitful in stamping out Child Sexual abuse

Listening and Dialogue Encounter Session Outline
The invitation to participate in a Plenary listening and dialogue session is open to everyone. This plenary process is helping us to develop a habit of dialogue as a national church and within our local communities . As such , groups are encouraged to meet more than once, with the suggested time for each gather anywhere from 60-90 minutes. The group may choose to focus on one or two topics at each meeting. By gathering with fellow parishioners, family members, friends and colleagues, new ideas may emerge and this might help us discover themes or questions that we may wish to share.
The following outline is offered as a suggestion for groups to follow in setting up a listening and dialogue encounter.

BEFORE YOU BEGIN:

- It is advisable that discussion groups are composed of not more than 4-6 members to ensure each voice is heard.
- Assign a facilitator in the group
- Assign a scribe for each group (different from the facilitator) who will record the discussion and ensure clear understanding of the same.
- Two discussion guides have been prepared to cater for adults ad for youth. Choose which process you are going to follow.
