Will you drop the vow of celibacy for priests and brothers?

- Many people in our community lead a celibate life through choice or circumstance. The Royal commission said there was no casual link between celibacy and child sexual abuse. The Catholic Church agrees with this assessment.
- The Sad reality is that those who sexually abuse children come from all walks of life and the overwhelming majority are people who haven't made a promise to be celibate.
- The Church must continue to asses and enhance the psychological and sexual maturity of people in ministry and much work has been done and continues to be done in this area.

Will you support greater roles for women?

- Women already have a major role to play in the life of the church including a range of important leadership roles
- Leaders of religious orders and bishops know that the people bring great strengths to the various areas of the church in which they serve and we will continue to nurture lay women and men and encourage them to make a contribution.
- That includes in the various structures like the implementation Advisory Group (IAG) and Catholic Profession Standards Ltd (CPSL), which are lay led groups with great responsibility for safeguarding, child protection and ministerial integrity measures among others.

World Mission Sunday

Pope Francis is inviting young men and women who want to follow Christ, to seek, to discover and to persevere in their vocation.

World Mission Sunday in 2018 falls on 21st October.

Instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1926, the annual day encourages prayers, cooperation and help for missions as well as reminds Christians about the fundamental missionary character of the Church and of every baptized person.

The theme of this year's observance, “Together with young people, let us bring the Gospel to all,” echoes the upcoming synod of bishops, scheduled from October 3-28 in the Vatican, whose theme is “Young People, the Faith and Vocational Discernment.”

In the message addressed to all Christians, but especially to young people, the Pope reminds all that “we are not in this world by our own choice,” and hence there is “an initiative that precedes us and makes us exist.” Each one of us, he says, is called to reflect on the fact that “I am a mission on this Earth,” which is why we are here in this world.

In fact, the Pope says, “**every man and woman is a mission.**” “To be attracted and to be sent are two movements” of the heart that “hold out promise for our future and give direction to our lives.”

All Christians by Baptism, the Pope recalls, have received *the mission to bring the Gospel to everyone.* Young people too are part of that great stream of witnesses, in which elder persons with their wisdom and experience become a witness and encouragement to the young. This way, he says, the mission of the Church bridges the generations bringing about unity.
