Us and Them

It was a warm Saturday morning, . Standing in the atrium of the shopping mall, I was holding my little tin for donations to assist a school catering to children and young people with physical disabilities. Since we were about to pack up, the coordinator of the collection was checking off the tins and doing the paperwork. Just them, a woman came past and dropped a donation in the tin. As I was about to thank her, she turned from me and addressed the coordinator: "It is a real shame, hey. What does that poor blind boy with the tin do all day? " She asked her. "He studies law" I answered.

What is at issue in this little anecdote, of course, is the stereotyping around disability - and the assumptions that many people bring to their interactions with a person the perceive to be different. People can very easily assume that an incapacity in one area is often transferred to other areas: I have lost count of the times when people have spoken LOUDLY and S-L-O-W-L-Y to me as blind person. Many or approximately 20 per cent of people in Australia living with disability could recount similar experience. Indeed, many of us have lived experience of much worse things, where our disabilities - and the undoubted imbalances of power they can create - have been taken advantage of power, money or even sexual gratification.
